RULES FOR DEBATE

SCHEME

The Debate Contest shall be held at 3 levels :

Preliminary Round : To select a team from each PCDA/CDA/CFA/IFA for zonal level contest.

Zonal Round : To select a team from each RTC for final round .

Final Round : To be organized during Training and Development Week

GENERAL RULES

1. The debate can be delivered either in Hindi or English.
2. The topics for the debate at the Preliminary , zonal and the final round are to be the same.
3. Each contestant would be given a maximum time limit of 4+1 minutes, during which they have to wind up their narrative; after which they would be timed out and it would call for negative marking.
4. Time starts as soon as the participant occupies the lectern/dais.
5. A bell will be rung by the time-keeper at the end of 4 minutes , to indicate that only one minute is left, for he participant to wind up.
6. The participants would be judged on their clarity of content, proficiency in the given language, diction, analytical skills, time -precision and concept clarity, brevity and nimbleness in dealing with the interjection questions.
7. Two interjections per contestant would be permitted to the audience at the end of each individual debate for each contestant.
8. The interjectors need to raise their hands , and the choice would be usually made by the compere/moderator based on the first visible basis.
9. The compere's decision regarding choice of interjector would be final.
10. Only one question would be allowed to one interjector.
11. No participant would be allowed to interject a fellow participant.
12. The judges' decision will be final.
